



Summon

Summon is a discovery layer; we're calling ours "General Search."


It contains entries from the catalogue (which are generally at the book title, journal title, or video title level) and adds entries at the article title or chapter title level.



Arca

Arca is an institutional repository.


Ours currently contains digitized copies of theses, dissertations, and projects.



<u> 360 Link</u>

360 Link is a link resolver; we generally refer to ours as the "Get it @ UNBC" service.

360 Link uses the OpenURL standard to get users from a citation to the full text in our e-resources, or to the ILL form.



E-Resources

Our e-resources are located under the "Databases" tab on the website.

Popular e-resources include Academic Search Complete, JSTOR, ScienceDirect, and Wiley. Generally we have very little control over the behaviour of these resources.

They can include: citations; e-journals; e-books; videos; images; or, data. They may fall along a spectrum of full-text availability:
